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ABOUT RESEARCH

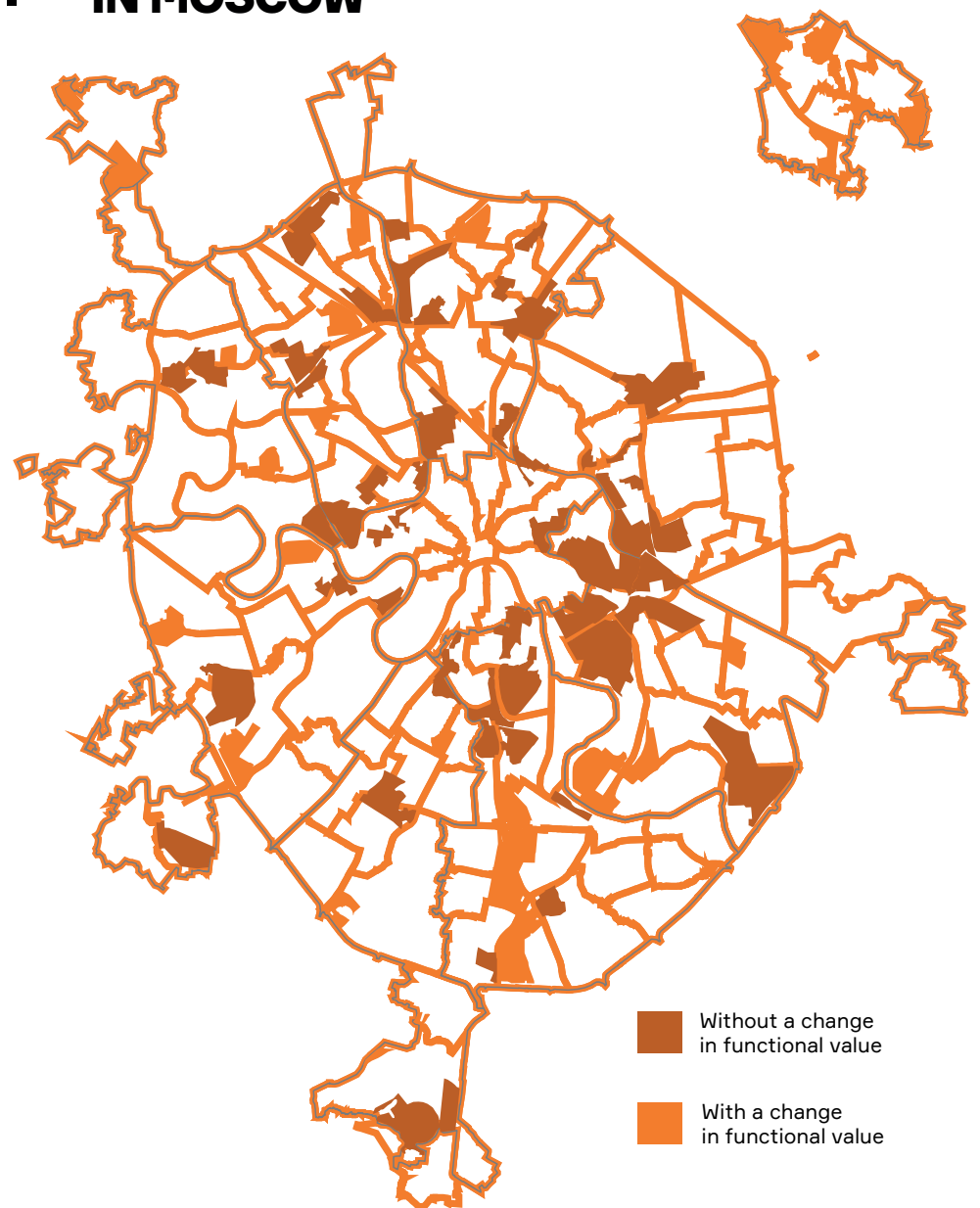
This study analyzes the unique characteristics of Moscow's production areas (within the old boundaries), which form the basis of their typology for redevelopment purposes: urban planning potential, the presence of industrial heritage sites, and the conditions of integration into the surrounding urban environment.

The study is based on the union of four professional areas – architecture, urban planning, industrial heritage and economics – and offers different scenarios of redevelopment of production zones of Moscow based on the analysis of current approaches and evolutionary trends in the development of production areas.

For the first time, production areas are considered in the historical and cultural aspect and ranked according to the presence of industrial heritage monuments. The most typical examples of redevelopment of historical production areas of Moscow since 2000 are examined in terms of functional saturation and effectiveness of the selected methods.

The proposed methodology ensures the creation of high-quality and diversity in the process of redevelopment.
